All our BrightStart girls have enjoyed decorating beautiful stars to display at All Saints' Church in Gosforth in preparation for the festive season!
















The Clay Club Halloween pumpkins were a huge hit and the girls got to keep their Halloween decorations as a keepsake.

STEM Extravaganza








